

 Booking fee (Includes administration and cleaning) \$50


Hire fees (per km driven)



- Be aware of your surroundings, stay connected with your community and take action for your safety at the first sign of fire or other emergency.

Rhyme Time Sessions at the Bridgetown Library

Singing and reading to babies from birth is one of the best things you can do to nurture their early learning and brain development.

Attending Rhyme Time is a great way to build children's early language skills, help them develop self-confidence and other essential life-long skills. Singing and reading to children is an important activity for building their skills and knowledge necessary for them to successfully learn to read when they begin school. Children who are good readers are usually successful learners.

Bridgetown Library currently hosts Baby Rhyme Time during the school term every Wednesday between 10am-11am with a fun variety of action, finger and nursery rhymes. The sessions are free and while our focus is on children from birth to three, all family members are welcome to attend. Previously run by the Child Health



Nurse, the position has been taken over and the program is being coordinated by our lovely, trained librarian Naomi, who delivers a fun and flexible session.

We would love to be able to extend the program to include Story Time using the Better Beginnings STEAM/ STEM approach (introducing Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Maths concepts to children while enjoying a good story).

Research has shown that an early exposure to books and stories substantially contributes to success in early literacy. There are strong links between literacy, school performance, self-esteem and life chances, with improved literacy skills being linked with higher education, earnings, health and social outcomes.



2018 / 2019 Firebreak Order notices have been sent to landowners along with their rates notice. Extra copies are available from Shire administration.

Firebreak construction and fuel reduction must be carried out as per the official notice and maintained throughout the season. For most landowners, firebreaks or fuel load management must be in place from 15 November 2018 to 26 April 2019. For plantations, the deadline is 1 November. Please refer to the official order to ensure you understand and will comply with the requirements.

Will you be burning on a verge? Verge burning requires a permit all year round. This permit can be obtained by contacting Ranger Services on 9761 0800.

Restricted burning is in place from 1 November to 14 December. During this time, permits are required for any and all burning that is being conducted. Permits to burn can be obtained from your Fire Control Officer (FCO). For a list of FCOs, refer to the back page of the Firebreak Notice. Please note that if you wish to burn on the verge in the restricted period, two permits will be required – a permit to burn from your FCO, and a verge burn permit from Rangers.

Inspections will be carried out throughout the season. Please ensure your property is compliant at all times during the required dates. Infringements and work orders may be issued if properties are not compliant with the Order.

Burning before 1 November. Permits are not required for burning being conducted before 1 November, however it is the responsibility of the person conducting the burn to ensure it is done safely. Proceed with caution at all times and ensure you have checked the weather forecast and have the means to extinguish the fire if necessary. Burning with caution lessens the chance that our volunteer firefighters will be called out to attend uncontrolled burns. Uncontrolled burns put lives and property in danger.

There are new penalties for breaching total fire bans. Under new legislation, \$1,000 on-the-spot fines can be issued for lighting fires or carrying out business that can start a fire on total fire ban days. During the 2016-17 bushfire season, almost one third of out-of-control fires on total fire ban days in WA started as a result of banned fire activities.

Restricted Burning is in effect between 1 November 2018 and 14 December 2018

Over the Restricted Burning period, any property owner or occupier of land wanting to burn a fire at their property (including garden refuse and rubbish) will need to obtain a Fire Permit from their Fire Control Officer. A Permit is required for all cooking and camping fires during the restricted burning period. Gas barbeques can still be used during the restricted and prohibited burning period.

Fire restrictions can start earlier or finish later than the dates indicated depending on conditions. Permits issued for burning in Restricted Burning periods are issued at the discretion of a Fire Control Officer. Check with your Fire Control Officer or the Shire Office for any variation to the fire restriction dates. Fire Control Officers for each area are listed on the back page of the Firebreak Order that accompanied your rates notice and are also available on the Shire website, www.bridgetown.wa.gov.au.

Road Safety Message from the Roadwise Advisory Committee

At the time of writing this article, 121 people havelost their lives on WA roads. Of these 75 deaths occurred in regionals areas, 20 of which were in the south west. WA Police, the Road Safety Commission, Main Roads WA and local governments through their Roadwise Committees all look at various ways of educating the community on potential risks when driving to try and stop people being killed on our roads.

In the lead-up to the recent September long weekend, Acting Road Safety Commissioner, Iain Cameron said "After decades of community education, the majority of West Australians understand the risks around drink driving, speeding and not wearing seatbelts".

"However, three out of four fatal and serious injury crashes on WA roads are not caused by a risktaking behaviour, but by someone who may be tired, a bit distracted or has a momentary lapse in concentration."

"A micro-sleep of four or five seconds at 110km/h is like driving the length of Optus Stadium with your eyes shut," said Mr Cameron.

"Fatigue is the silent killer on our roads, please don't drive after being awake for a long period of time, make sure you're well rested, plan your journey with regular stops along the way and if you can, switch drivers."

Although this message was aimed for driver awareness over the September long weekend, Mr Cameron's message about fatigue is something we should be aware of at all times throughout the year. Many people in our community commute to Bunbury or Manjimup on a daily basis and although this drive may not be as long as what some people would do when going on holidays, tiredness can creep up very quickly and the daily drive may make some people a bit complacent. Stopping for a few minutes to get a breath of fresh air could make a huge difference and ensure you arrive home safely.

Road Ribbons for Road Safety

From mid-November through to early-January each year, WALGA provides ribbons for community members to wear to show their commitment to road safety. Ribbons will be available for collection from the Shire's customer service area from Monday, 19 November.

Accessing Your Community

The members of the Access and Inclusion Advisory Committee have been very busy over the past 2 months hosting a morning tea for community members over the age of 60 at Bridgetown Pottery Restaurant. The morning tea was attended by over 60 people from across the Shire. Committee members also visited every business in the CBD, measured and calculated the accessibility of the entrances to each business and have compiled an 'Accessible Businesses List' for visitors and community members to use when accessing services in the CBD. The 'Accessible Business List' can be viewed on the Shire web site and the Visitor Centre website www.bridgetown.com.au/about-us/accessible-businesses.

Three new ACROD bays will soon be installed around the CBD. There will be an ACROD bay next to Howard Evans Solicitor offices near IGA, another bay will be installed in the Shire car park with a third being installed in the Bridgetown CRC car park, which will include the completion of works on the access path to ensure easy access to the Post Office and the northern section of town. As well as the ACROD bays the old infirm bays adjacent to IGA, Barney and Fleur and the Post Office will be converted to 20min only parking. All parking bays directly adjacent to IGA will have a reduced time limit of 1 hour to assist people with mobility challenges to access the pharmacy and IGA.

Having an emergency kit is an important step to prepare and protect your household for an emergency such as a bushfire.

Keep your Emergency Survival Kit in a storage container in a location that is easy to get to and where the whole family knows about.

Things to include in your kit are:

- Portable battery-operated AM/ FM radio
- Waterproof torch
- Spare batteries
- First aid kit with manual
- ·Candles with waterproof matches
- Clothing and Woollen blankets
- ·Phone and charger
- Water
- Money
- Toiletries
- •Scans of Important Documents
- Copies of important photographs
- •Photographs of valuable household items
- Emergency contact numbers

And don't forget to prepare for your pets as well. Make sure your pet is wearing an identification tag. If you're leaving, take a leash, basket, medication, food and a familiar toy for your animal, it will help reduce stress.

Community Home Care - Bridgetown

Community Home Care Bridgetown (CHC) is a community service that is funded by HACC, to provide transport needs for those people who are HACC eligible (people who are not HACC eligible will be charged a higher negotiated fee based on the actual cost of the kilometres travelled in the trip - see costs below). CHC is committed to supporting people to maintain their independence.

People who have mobility challenges due to age or disability may need support to continue to live as independently as possible. CHC understands that maintaining personal choice and control is essential to each person's wellbeing.

Transport assistance to support travel needs include:

- Medical Appointments
- Allied Health appointments
- Shopping
- Banking
- Social Events
- Maintaining Family Connections

The Transport Service will pick you up from your home, drive you to your destination and return you home.

Are You Eligible?

Before being able to access this service you will require a current HACC assessment. To discuss your eligibility for HACC support please call the Regional Assessment Service on 1300 785 415.

Cost of Services

Fees are required to be paid as a contribution towards the cost of the transport service. The fees are based on the WA HACC Program's Standard Fee Schedule and your level of income. Transport Clients are charged per trip and the amount charged differs depending on the distance travelled.

This means that a journey from home to your destination and returning home again is classified as two trips. Pension Fuel Card Travel Assistance is available.

Prices listed are one way only:

Up to 10km \$ 5 per trip

11km - 30km \$ 8 per trip

31 km - 60km \$10 per trip

61 km - 99km \$15 per trip

If you wish to travel over 99km please contact Community Home Care to discuss options such as PATS (Patient Assisted Travel Scheme).

Trails Development Advisory Committee

These trail blazers have been working on a number of projects over the past 6 months including the completion of the Shire Walk Trail Booklet (available at the Bridgetown Visitor Centre, Shire Administration and Greenbushes CRC). Both the Wandoo Walk and the Old Abattoir Walk have had a record number of visitations during September and October.

The Trails Development Advisory Committee have also been working in close partnership with members of the Blackwood Mountain Bike and Cycling Club Inc. and officers from Parks and Wildlife to undertake the first stages of the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions trail planning process.

Completing this process ensures the committee will develop an approved mountain bike trail network that can be promoted and enjoyed by community members and visitors alike. There is a long way to go to achieve the quality trail network, however, the process is well on its way.

Greenbushes to Bridgetown Shopping Bus Run

The Community Bus "Miss Rosie" shopping run service continues to operate on alternative Tuesdays from Greenbushes to Bridgetown and return. This service is available at a cost of \$8 to anyone living in Greenbushes who would like to come to Bridgetown for the morning – shopping, medical appointments, whatever you need!

The bus run operates every second Tuesday departing Greenbushes Roadhouse at 9.00am and departs Bridgetown for her return journey from outside Blackwood Butchers at 11.30am. Parcels may be deposited in the bus anytime between arrival and departure, so heavy shopping does not have to be carried.
