Council meetings are held on the last Thursday of each month. November's meeting was the first ordinary council meeting since the recent local government elections.

A range of issues were addressed by Council at the October meeting including:

- Council's Establishment of Committee's Advisory and Delegates to External Committees
- Solar Power Replacements at Catterick and Maranup Bush **Fire Stations**
- Introduction of new а temporary bus fee and service

for travelling to skate parks outside of the Shire while the work is being done on the **Bridgetown Youth Precinct**

- Waiver of Stallholder Fees for **Proposed Farmers Markets**
- Suspension of Enforcement of 2 of 2021/2022 Section Firebreak & Fuel Hazard Reduction Notice (for an initial period of 2 weeks).

Singin' in the Shower (Being Waterwise!)

Switching to a water efficient showerhead efficiency:

showerheads can save you up to 20,000 litres of water each year! We still have stock from the Waterwise Showerhead Swap Program, and a 4minute shower hourglass to remind you when it's time to hop out! Waterwise even has a Spotify playlist with 4-minute songs. What a treat to conserve water while grooving to your favourite tunes!

Last year in Bridgetown we had 42 showerheads swapped which provided a combined annual water saving of 580,000 litres.

Bushfire Mitigation Funding

published 5 Oct 2021

We have been successful in securing \$188,935 through the Mitigation Activity Fund Grants program to carry extra bush fire mitigation activities through the Shire. Activities include mechanical treatments to reduce fuel levels, creation of firebreaks and planned burns.

Before each bushfire season, the Bushfire Mitigation Coordinator identifies suitable for areas treatment using historical data and through observations. Prior to a prescribed burn our bush fire mitigation team check that tracks are clear, prepare the area by raking around old trees and then undertake a cold burn followed by mop-up.

The activities we will undertake are:

- 15 prescribed burns
- 16 mechanical treatments
- 1 track development
- 1 chemical treatment

Footpaths around the building may also be (temporarily) closed at different times.
